We are half-way through "the decade of action" when the UN Global Sustainability Goals (SDGs) should be met, and emissions should be halved.



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Why this project? Why now?

The importance of Education for Sustainable Development (ESD) in Early Childhood Education and Care (ECEC)

Starts at Birth: Education begins at birth. ESD in ECEC engages children in meaningful ways, supported by adults with appropriate curricula



<u>Responds to Urgent Global Challenges</u>: ESD is a response to the urgent and dramatic challenges the planet faces

) <u>Has Gained Global Recognition</u>: The launch of the Greening Education Hub at COP28 in 2023 highlights the global commitment to integrating sustainability into education



Why handprints instead of footprints?

Why emphasise handprints over footprints in ESD? Why are the '8 Friends' (characters in our course) represented as handprints?

Positive Impact: Our handprint represents the positive actions we take toward sustainability, suggesting a hands-on approach to making a difference

) Joy in Learning: Education should be a joyful experience, instilling hope and a positive vision for the future rather than fear or burden



<u>Appropriate Responsibility</u>: While children play an important role in mitigating environmental issues, it is essential to assign responsibility where it belongs and not overburden children as "saviours of sustainability" for problems created by adults

Designing the course

- ESD course in 8 modules, each partner responsible for one or two modules
- Learning, Teaching, Training activities with ECEC educators from each country, leading to development of the course
- Multiplier Events

Kristianstad KR University

- Adaptation of the course to teacher programmes and student teachers in the different countries
- 5 languages, catered for multiple curricula

From Fragmented to Holistic

Digital Transformation of Educational Content

- <u>Content Cohesion</u>: A dedicated text team ensured seamless, accessible transitions from theory, produced by several partners, to coherent digital content
- <u>Tone Consistency</u>: The text team focused on maintaining a uniform voice to engage learners effectively
- <u>Translation</u>: Performed in two stages by each partner / country
- <u>Visual Harmony</u>: A dedicated image team aligned photos with text and created videos to enhance learning
- <u>Technical Adaptation</u>: edChild's tech team improved the ECE Academy app for optimal course delivery
- <u>Collaborative Creation</u>: edChild collaborated with an external company to develop interactive '8 Friends' materials




Get to know the '8 Friends' characters

Purple Petra loves her team And all kinds of new things work with her



Key takeaways from children

- Set clear (and ambitious) goals
- Define roles and responsibilities for coordination
- Promote transparent communication
- Embrace inclusion and diversity meeting people who do things in a different way is the beauty of a large-scale project
- And be agile and willing to change it will not turn out the way you thought which is probably for the better [©]



Teacher training courses

Examples from the project partners

- Discussing module 3 (Building a Caring and Inclusive Community) between student teachers and supervisors on University's Supervision Day
- Engaging student teachers with course content through seminars and applying it with children during practice periods, followed by reflections
- Organising students into groups of four to explore the introductory module and one selected module, enhancing it with additional topics, questions, and suggested activities for children in ECEC settings
